Why Hygiene Kits Matter

Support personal health and dignity

Distributed year-round through mobile outreach

Designed for use without access to running water

Easy for groups of any size to assemble

A tangible way for organizations to serve their community

Hygiene kits are one of the most requested outreach items and remain a constant need.

About Hygiene Kits

Hygiene kits provide essential personal care items to individuals experiencing homelessness. These kits are designed for immediate use and help promote health, dignity, and comfort for people living without consistent access to basic hygiene. Businesses, churches, schools, and community organizations can make a meaningful impact by organizing a hygiene kit drive using AZFH's approved standards. Hygiene kits are distributed year-round through AZFH's mobile outreach across Maricopa County.



How to Organize a Hygiene Kit Drive

Step 1: Choose Your Drive Format

You may organize your hygiene kit drive in one or more of the following ways:

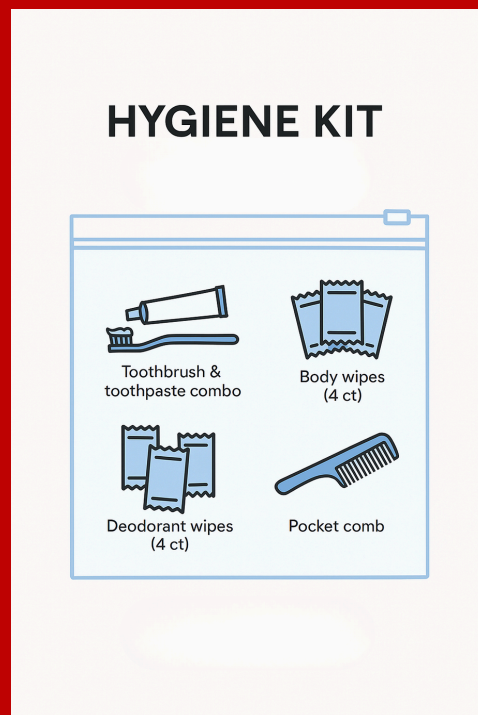
- Assemble complete hygiene kits as a group activity
- Collect individual hygiene items to be assembled later
- Purchase items directly from AZFH's Amazon Wish Lists
- Host a one-day event or a multi-week drive

Step 2: Collect Approved Items

Please use only the approved hygiene kit items listed below. This ensures kits are safe, practical, and immediately usable during outreach.

AZFH Basic Hygiene Kit Includes:

- Toothbrush + toothpaste combo (1)
- Body wipes (4 count, individually wrapped)
- Deodorant wipes (4 count, individually wrapped)
- Pocket comb (1)



Approved Bag Options

Kits should be assembled in one bag using any of the following options:

- Gallon-size zip-top bags
- Drawstring bags
- Reusable shopping bags

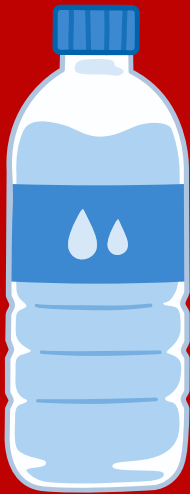


Optional Summer Heat-Relief Add-Ons

During extreme Arizona heat, AZFH may distribute additional seasonal items. These items are optional and should be packed separately unless otherwise requested.

Optional heat-relief items include:

- Bottled water (single-serve, factory sealed)
- Electrolyte drink packets (non-caffeinated)
- Cooling towels (individually packaged)
- Sunscreen (travel size, SPF 30+, non-aerosol)
- Lip balm (tube or stick, non-medicated)



Important Safety Guidelines – Do NOT Include

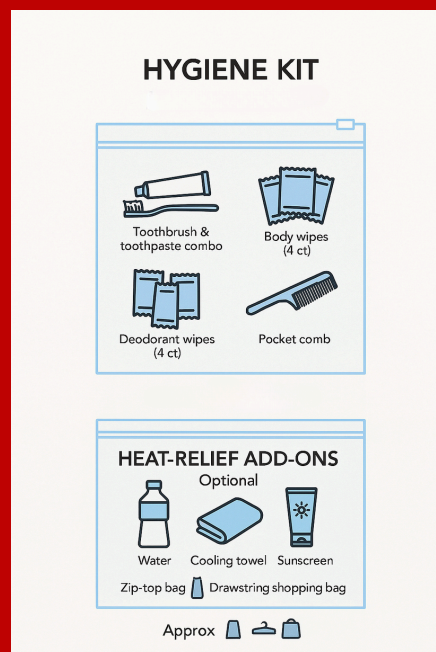
For safety reasons, please do NOT include:

- Liquid hand sanitizer
- Aerosols
- Stick or spray deodorant
- Sharp objects or loose items

AZFH provides these guidelines to ensure kit safety, especially during extreme heat conditions.

Step 3: Assemble Kits

Place all core hygiene items into one approved bag
Ensure items are sealed, lightweight, and easy to carry
Do not overfill bags or substitute unapproved items



Step 4: Schedule Drop-Off or Pick-Up
